Responsibilities - The post holder will be responsible for;

- Supporting high quality patient discharge, to ensure a timely, responsive and appropriate service for all key parties involved, including patients, their families, MUH Multi-disciplinary team and external bodies.
- As an ongoing process, assesses patients, their circumstances and plans their transition from the acute hospital environment to an appropriate setting to meet the patient needs when discharged.
- Collaborate with Consultants and Associated Health Care Team Member to ensure clinical documentation which supports a holistic and clear plan of care and discharge readiness.
- Work closely with the Medical Social Work Team and the Allied Health Professional Groups to provide a comprehensive transition or discharge plan for any long term patients.
- Liaise with Primary Care Team members in relation to discharge where appropriate.
- Ensure the patient and family are kept up to date with patient progress and estimated date of discharge as agreed in collaboration with the Primary Consultant, the Ward Manager and the applicable Multidisciplinary Team Members.
- Analysing clinical information and makes recommendations regarding appropriateness of care, while keeping in mind the patient's individual needs and limitations.
- Liaise with Ward Staff to ensure the delivery of the agreed transition plan as well as the execution of an education plan as required by the patient and family.

Eligibility Criteria - Candidates:

- Be registered in the General Division of the Register of Nurses kept by the Nursing and Midwifery Board of Ireland (NMBI)
- Have at least five years post registration experience in an acute hospital setting
- Provide evidence of clinical and professional managerial ability, leadership, communication and organisational skills.
- Excellent interpersonal skills
- Provide evidence of ongoing professional development
- Evidence of leading clinical practice initiatives
- Evidence of promotion of multi-disciplinary team work
